APSID Hanoi Winter School 2015

The first APSID Winter School was successfully held in Hanoi. Vietnam from 26th - 29th November 2015. Led by 6 international Faculty (Prof Hans Ochs, Prof Yu-Lung Lau, Prof Reinhard Seger, Prof Shigeaki Nonoyama, Prof Roger Kobayashi and Dr Daniel Suez), 29 young paediatricians from 10 Asian countries participated in a 2-day residential course focusing on the diagnosis and management of primary immunodeficiency disorders. 1



Lectures given by the Faculty provided essential knowledge base on PID, but a large portion of the Winter School was contributed by active participation of the young doctors who presented cases which they studied and managed. The learning process started well before the Winter School, as they received advice from their local supervisors and the APSID Winter School tutors (Dr Woei Kang Liew, Dr Jonie Santos-Ocampo and Dr Pamela Lee) as they prepared their case presentations.

The discussion was centered around the key learning issues identified by the presenter, and was enthusiastically participated by other fellow trainees and the Faculty.

"Interesting to learn about very rare disease. Also interesting to learn about different region of practice, genetic, bacterial regime differences and diagnostic and therapeutic capabilities."






